

An Introductory Guide to Government **Contracting for Hurricane Recovery** in North Carolina

In the wake of Hurricane Helene's devastating impact on Western North Carolina, the state faces the need for reconstruction and recovery efforts. Contractors and service providers have a unique opportunity to contribute to the rebuilding process through potential state and federal contracts. This list of resources from the state's procurement system, eProcurement, has been compiled to assist organizations in navigating the state contracting process. In addition, you will find information regarding registration for federal contracting opportunities and working with FEMA. Whether you're looking to provide emergency services, infrastructure repair, or community rebuilding support, this guide will help you through the necessary steps to become involved in the recovery process.



HOW TO BECOME A NORTH CAROLINA STATE CONTRACT VENDOR

North Carolina eProcurement To do business with the state of North Carolina, vendor must register their company on the electronic Vendor Portal (eVP) and are required to manage their own account and keep it fully up to date.

HUBZone and NC Small Business Enterprise

Registration (if applicable) Vendors may register for NC eProcurement and begin the Historically Underutilized Business and/or North Carolina Small Business Enterprise application processes

all from the same eVP account registration.

Collaboration Requests

Collaboration Requests are used by NC eProcurement buyers to work with multiple vendors on the best pricing for goods and services. Vendors will receive a notification that they have been sent a collaboration request and can then choose to respond with a quote, called a collaboration proposal, for the requested items. After the collaboration request has been closed, the buyer can then review all received responses and work with the vendor that sent in the best proposal for the goods and/or services.



Solicitations

Watch for relevant solicitations. All solicitations will be posted in eVP. Vendors will respond in eVP or through the Ariba Business Network.

Purchase Order Statuses

Vendors using an Ariba Network account to do business with the state of North Carolina can create order confirmations, ship notices, or reject the entire order.

FEDERAL REQUIREMENTS FOR DISASTER RECOVERY

Federal participation is separate from state requirements. The information provided here is to give you a full picture of how to engage in both state and federal contracting for disaster recovery efforts.

Register with SAM.gov SAM.gov is the federal government's portal for managing procurement and contracts. To compete for federal disaster recovery contracts, your business must be registered and assigned a Unique Entity Identifier (UEI) and Cage Code. Visit <u>SAM.gov</u> for more information on registration.

U.S. Army Corps of Engineers (USACE) Vendor Registration If your business specializes in construction, engineering, or public works, you may want to register. The USACE manages disaster recovery efforts, particularly in infrastructure rebuilding. For more information, visit USACE Contractor Database.

FEMA Industry Liaison Program The FEMA Industry Liaison Program (ILP) connects private sector businesses with FEMA's contracting needs. By submitting a vendor profile, businesses can be considered for contracts related to disaster recovery. Learn more: Doing Business with FEMA.
